Bids will be evaluated on the 80/20 system where 80 points is for price and 20 points for BBEE level contributor.

Stage 1:

Assessment of functionality. Only service providers, who will achieve a minimum of 60% of the total available points, in accordance with the criteria will qualify for stage two of the evaluation.

The below formula will be used to calculate Functionality using the criteria mentioned below.

2. Summary

B. AWARDING OF CONTRACT, COMPLETION AND PENALTIES

1. The successful bidders will have to enter into Service Level Agreement With the Municipality.
2. The date of commencement of the Contract will be advised after adjudication of the Tender.
3. Tenderers shall furthermore note that goods or services will not be considered acceptable and consequently their obligations not fulfilled should goods or services fail to comply with the specifications in the Tender document.
