

	to the community is via a gravel road 5km off the Sani
	Pass Road between Himeville and Sani Pass.
Background and photos	The KwaPitela Community was previously served by one
	borehole handpumps, two locally protected springs and
	the Mkhomazana River. Funding was made available to
	Sisonke District Municipality by DTLGA as part of
	CMIP (now MIG) Programme. The KwaPitela water
	project is one of the infrastructure development
	projects identified to improve the lives of the
	residents of the village.
